Dr. LIU graduated from *Peking University Graduate School* and got his M.D. degree in 2000. Then he finished his post-doctoral training and has been working in the Department of Cardiology (now Heart Center). He dedicated himself in the field of prevention and management of cardiovascular disease and specialized in coronary heart disease, hypertension, dyslipidemia and thrombosis. He has established the first outpatient clinic of metabolic syndrome in China since 2004.

Dr. LIU has published more than 100 original articles, editorials, reviews and translation papers in the national or international journals and 10 Chapters of monographs in the past decade. He has been working hard on dissemination of medical science. He was the editor-in-chief of *Aspirin*, the first popularized book on this topic issued in 2009. Dr. LIU was the first prize winner of the CCTaP Young Investigators Award sponsored by *World Heart Federation (WHF)* and *International Society of Cardiovascular Pharmacotherapy (ISCP)* in 2004 and Quaker fellowship of World Congress of Cardiology (WCC) in 2010.

Dr. LIU is currently a member of *European Society of Cardiology (ESC)* and member of ESC Council on Hypertension. He has joined in *European Society of Hypertension (ESH)* and he is a member of ESH Working group on blood pressure monitoring and cardiovascular variability. He is also an international member of *Vascular Biology Working Group (VBWG)*. He is now the editorial board member of *British Medical Journal (BMJ)* Chinese edition, *Chinese Journal of Hypertension*, and a corresponding editor of *Chinese Journal of Diabetes*, a specially invited reviewer of *China Medicine & Pharmacy*. He is in the youth editorial board of *International Circulation*. Dr. LIU was invited as faculty of 27th *European meeting on Hypertension and Cardiovascular Protection* in 2017.
